## Reforming Fees in the United Kingdom Supreme Court

7 November 2023

A Ministry of Justice (MoJ) consultation proposes a series of reforms to the fees payable in the Supreme Court of the United Kingdom. The proposals include (1) combining certain fees; (2) removing the distinction between devolution jurisdiction case and civil case fees; (3) increasing fees using CPI and (4) future routine reviews and uplifts in court fees.
